PRESS SATEMENT:

<u>UPC URGES GOVERNMENT TO ADDRESS THE CURRENT HEALTH CRISIS</u>

1. Uganda Peoples'Congress notes with Concern the manner in which Ministry of Health has handled the issue of the radiotherapy equipment at the Uganda Cancer Institute, a large number of patient's lives are at risk since they cannot access treatment. Not only that, according to the Ministry of Health, presently, 25% of the Ugandan teenagers become pregnant by the age of 19. About 49% are married before their 18th birthday and they start getting babies until their mid 40s.

Adolescents face a host of other sexual and reproductive health challenges. Complicated child births and abortions often requiring Emergency Obstetric Care are widespread. Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) including HIV infection are also common. Large families with poorly spaced children define a typical Ugandan rural community.

Adolescents constitute the highest demographic sogment in Uganda yet sexual and reproductive information and health services to meet their needs are still limited. It our considered view that;

- Government comprehensively looks into the issue of budgetary (i) allocation to the health sector. Therefore a greater emphasis would be placed on the training of health workers, planning for the procurement of equipment and facilities in time to avert disaster.
- That Government creates cancer units in all Regional Referral (ii) Hospitals with the necessary equipment and supportive research initiatives.
- All equipment in hospitals should be planned for financially as (iii) their useful lives are well known in advance, along with their regular maintenance. These are basic accounting procedures that the management should be aware of and implementing.

UPC has always questioned the agreements and structuring for such funding as they were made without critical thought and were expedient by design. The net result has seen conditions attached to such funding/aid where the focus on social spending has been marginalized and priority being given to "security" and other non-productive sectors.
