This calls for an overhaul of the entire syllabus and curricula in order to produce Students who can meet our Development needs and challenges to compete world over .The next challenge to both the parents and candidates is to secure places to enable further Education for 2016-2017 academic year.
- 2. Makerere University "Annual" Students strike due to fees Payment policy has led to running battles with the police and a convincing explanation is yet to be given. We consume more than we invest we do not produce but import more Uganda current account balance (money in Gold) is too low due to debt repayments, therefore UPC Calls upon government to critically look at measures of replenishing our reserves.
